Pack, being all of the directors of The Industrial Development Board of Anderson County, are hereby authorized to amend the Charter in accordance with the Amendment to the Charter attached to the aforesaid application.

AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF INCORPORATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD OF ANDERSON COUNTY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 7-53-204 of Tennessee Code Annotated, the undersigned, being all of the directors of The Industrial Development Board of Anderson County, adopt the following amendment to its Charter of Incorporation:

- 1. The name of the corporation is: The Industrial Development Board of Anderson County.
- 2. The text of each amendment adopted is:
 - Article I is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are, among others, the constructing, acquiring, improving, repairing, renovating, extending, equipping, furnishing, operating, maintaining and managing one or more "projects," as such term is defined in Title 7, Chapter 53, Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"), within or without the County of Anderson, Tennessee, the borrowing of funds to carry out any of its purposes and powers with respect to any such project or projects and the lending of funds for any such purpose; and the exercise of any and all powers conferred by the laws and statutes of the State of Tennessee, including the Act.

Article IV is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The Corporation shall have all powers necessary to carry out the purposes set forth in Article I herein as are authorized under the laws of the State of Tennessee, including without limitation the Act, as heretofore and hereafter amended, and including all powers incidental thereto or necessary for the performance thereof, excepting only such lawful limitations on, and additions to, such powers and authorities as expressly provided herein. To that end, it is hereby declared that should any provision or provisions of this Charter of Incorporation, which limit(s) or add(s) to, such powers and authorities, be declared invalid, unlawful, or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity, unlawfulness, or unenforceability of such provision or provisions shall not affect the remaining provisions of such Charter of Incorporation, and that this Charter of Incorporation shall have full force and effect according to its provisions excepting those provision(s) so declared invalid, unlawful, or unenforceable.

Article V is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

The Corporation is organized under the provisions of the Act.

The following new Article VI is added:

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the Corporation then outstanding and unpaid, all assets of the Corporation shall be distributed to Anderson County, Tennessee.

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RESOLUTION PROHIBITING ALL WEAPONS BEYOND THE SECURITY CHECKPOINTS ON THE THIRD FLOOR OF THE ANDERSON COUNTY COURTHOUSE AND THE JUVENILE COURT LEVEL OF THE JOLLEY BUILDING AT ALL TIMES WHILE JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS ARE IN PROGRESS.

WHEREAS, in an effort to ensure the safety of judges, lawyers, court personnel, litigants, witnesses, employees and observers and to assure the proper decorum and deportment during judicial proceedings, the Anderson County Board of Commissioners desires to prohibit weapons of all types beyond the security checkpoints on the third floor of the courthouse and the Juvenile Court level of the Jolley Building; and

WHEREAS, the Anderson County Board of Commissioners wishes to exercise its lawful power to prohibit weapons in governmental buildings provided by *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 39-17-1359; and

WHEREAS, Tenn. Code Ann. §39-17-1359 reads in pertinent as follows:

- (a)(1) Except as provided in $\S 39-17-1313$, an individual, corporation, business entity or local, state or federal government entity or agent thereof is authorized to prohibit the possession of weapons by any person who is at a meeting conducted by, or on property owned, operated, or managed or under the control of the individual, corporation, business entity or government entity.
- (a)(2) The prohibition in subsection (a)(1) shall apply to any person who is authorized to carry a firearm by authority of $\S 39-17-1351$.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Anderson County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session this 19th day of May 2014 that henceforth the following sections are approved and shall be enforced:

SECTION 1: All weapons of any type are prohibited beyond the security checkpoints on the third floor of the courthouse and the Juvenile Court level of the Jolley Building while judicial proceedings are in progress. This shall only include the periods from the establishment of the security checkpoints, using metal detectors and assigned court security officers, until judicial proceedings are ended in that area each day. The end of judicial proceedings is defined as 30 minutes after the last scheduled judicial proceeding has adjourned or has otherwise been completed or cancelled. This would include judicial proceedings conducted in chambers,

offices, and courtrooms. Judicial proceedings are defined as official documented proceedings or hearings with a judge present.

SECTION 2: Appropriate signage meeting the requirements of *Tenn. Code Ann. §39-17-1359(b)* shall be prominently displayed at the security checkpoint near the entry to the metal detectors and all public entrances to these areas while this prohibition is in place in order to provide due and proper notice to visitors of this prohibition. These signs shall be mounted in a manner such that they can be easily removed when judicial proceedings in the associated area have ended for the day.

SECTION 3: These provisions shall not apply to certified law enforcement officers, federal and state law enforcement officers, correctional officers, court security personnel, or judges during the course of their official duties; or to other persons authorized by the court to possess weapons in judicial proceedings in accordance with *Tenn. Code Ann.* §39-17-1306(c).

SECTION 4: At any time it should be determined necessary to conduct judicial proceedings in any room on the third floor of the courthouse, or on the Juvenile Court level of the Jolley Building, this prohibition may be placed in effect. If the area is occupied, verbal notification of the prohibition shall be communicated, the signs shall be posted, and a search should be conducted throughout the affected area. Rescreening of individuals present may be conducted.

SECTION 5: A violation of *Tenn. Code Ann.* §39-17-1306 is a Class E Felony. A violation of *Tenn. Code Ann.* §39-17-1359 is a Class B Misdemeanor.
