

A RESOLUTION TO URGE PASSAGE OF THE TENNESSEE BROADBAND ACCESSIBILITYACT BY THE TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

WHEREAS, Tennessee currently ranks 29th in the United States for broadband access; and

WHEREAS, a 2016 report for the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development found that Anderson County ranked ninth in the Top 10 counties in the State without broadband access; and

WHEREAS, 13 percent of the state lacks access to broadband and 34 percent of the state's rural residents do not have broadband coverage at the recognized minimum standards because of low population density and/or geographical constraints; and

WHEREAS, broadband access is critical for business, education, health care, and agriculture; and

WHEREAS, in response to this critical need for increased broadband access, Governor Haslam has proposed the Tennessee Broadband Accessibility Act, which would provide grants and tax credits to encourage deployment of broadband to previously unserved areas; and

WHEREAS, in addition to grants and tax credits, the Act would authorize the state's private, non-profit electric cooperatives to provide broadband throughout their territories; and


WHEREAS, the Act also provides grant opportunities for local libraries to help the libraries provide more digital literacy training to the state's citizens; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislative Body of Anderson County, Tennessee believes the Tennessee Broadband Accessibility Act provides necessary and reasonable steps to improve broadband access in the state.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Anderson County Board of Commissioners, meeting in session at Clinton, Tennessee, on the 21st day of February, 2017, that the Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to pass the Tennessee Broadband Accessibility Act in order to increase broadband accessibility in the state.

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE TOWN OF OLIVER SPRINGS IN ITS REQUEST TO TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO WIDEN A NINE-MILE PORTION OF STATE HIGHWAY 61 BETWEEN OLIVER SPRINGS AND HARRIMAN

WHEREAS, the route between Oliver Springs and Harriman on State Highway 61 is utilized by thousands of motorists a day commuting to and from work; and

WHEREAS, there is a portion of State Highway 61 that is approximately nine miles in length that is a two-lane highway, north- and sound-bound; and

WHEREAS, when an area is served by a four-lane highway rather than a two-lane highway, economic growth happens at a faster rate; and

WHEREAS, there have been at least 114 vehicle accidents on this stretch of highway from February 2013 through December 2016, at least 33 of these were wrecks with injury; and

WHEREAS, it is possible to travel from Chattanooga to Clinton, Tennessee, on a four-lane highway with the exception of this nine-mile stretch;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Anderson County Board of Commissioners supports the Town of Oliver Springs in its request that the Tennessee Department of Transportation consider this project for the safety of the residents of Anderson and Roane Counties as well as the thousands of citizens who travel that road daily;

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we request this project be prioritized due to the safety concerns.
